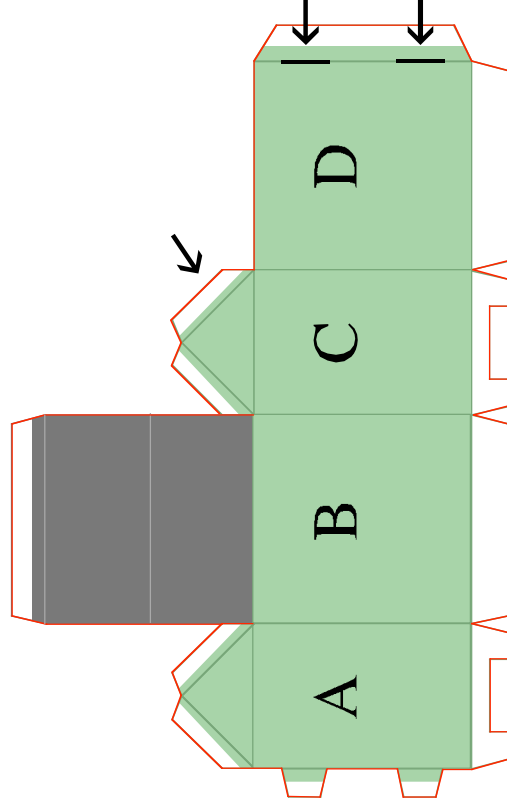


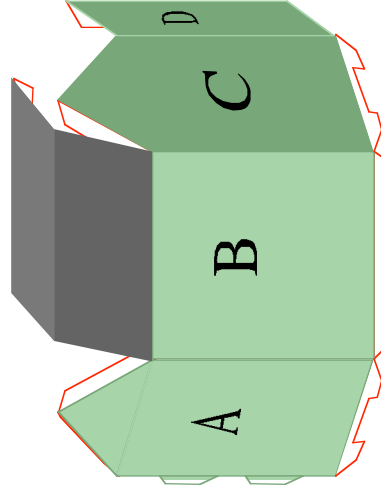
Meddybemps Miniature Village™

Construction Guide

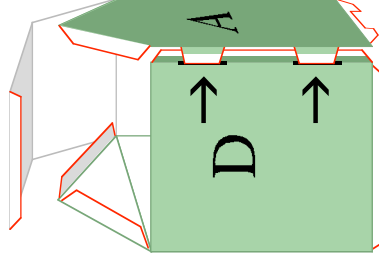
This guide is meant to help you understand how the miniature village buildings go together. Not all are exactly like this example. Some are reversed. Some have chimneys. Some are different in other ways, but they all use common techniques for folding, using tabs, and applying tape to hold them together in a sturdy fashion. Glue may be used instead of tape.



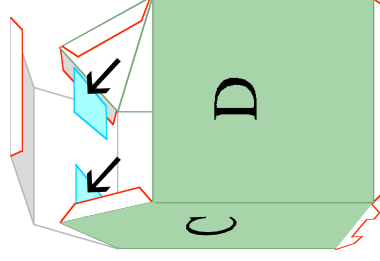
1 Cut out buildings along red guidelines using scissors or a hobby knife. Cut slits for tabs where indicated.



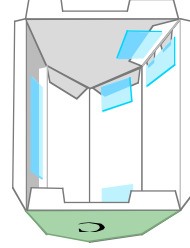
2 Fold along all obvious fold lines.



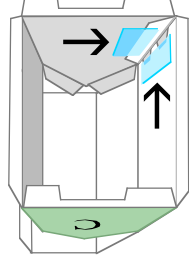
3 Slip tabs of A side into slits on D side.



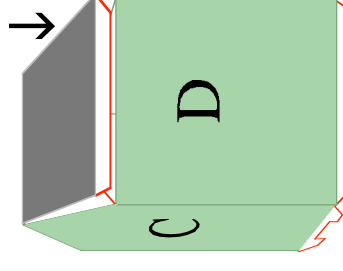
5 Tape folded-over parts of A and C to the inside of the roof. It isn't necessary to do the front ones, but you can.



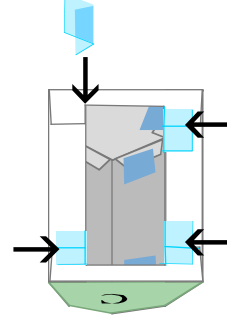
7 View from bottom showing taped areas.



4 Tape down the tabs and the folded-over part of the D side.



6 Fold the roof over and insert its folded-over edge behind side D. Secure with tape. See 7.

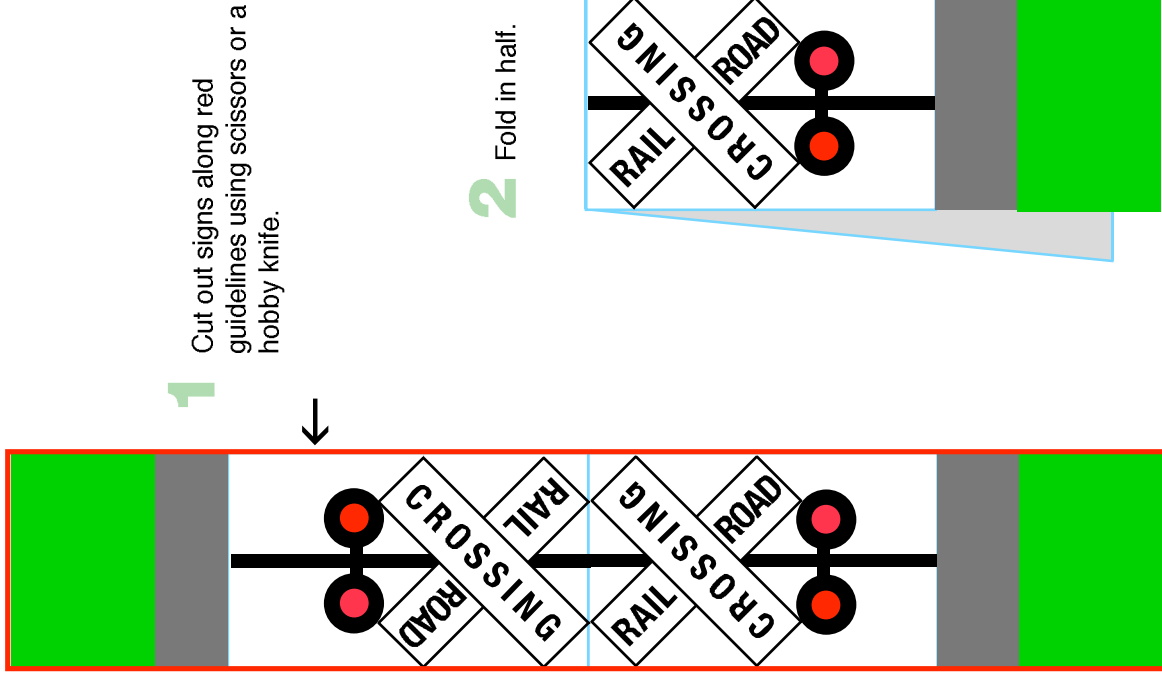


8 Fold over bottom panels. Tape where they overlap to make structure rigid.

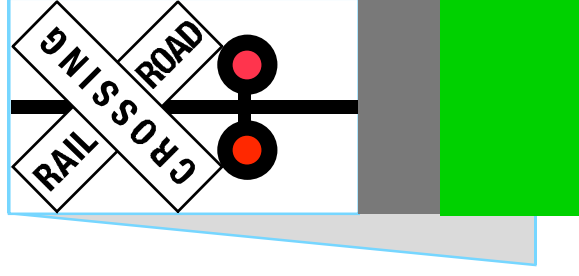

Signs Guide

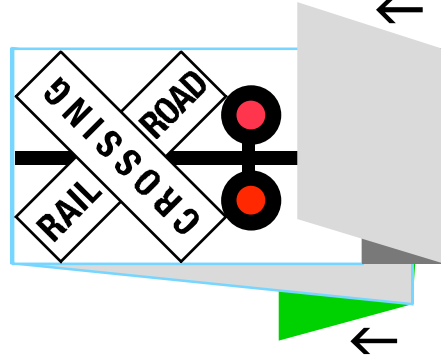
This is a simple technique for making sturdy signs.



2 Fold in half.



3 Fold the "grass" areas upward.



4 Squeeze the halves together. (You could apply double-sided tape between them, but it isn't necessary to do so). Fold the "grass" flat and apply tape to the underside.
